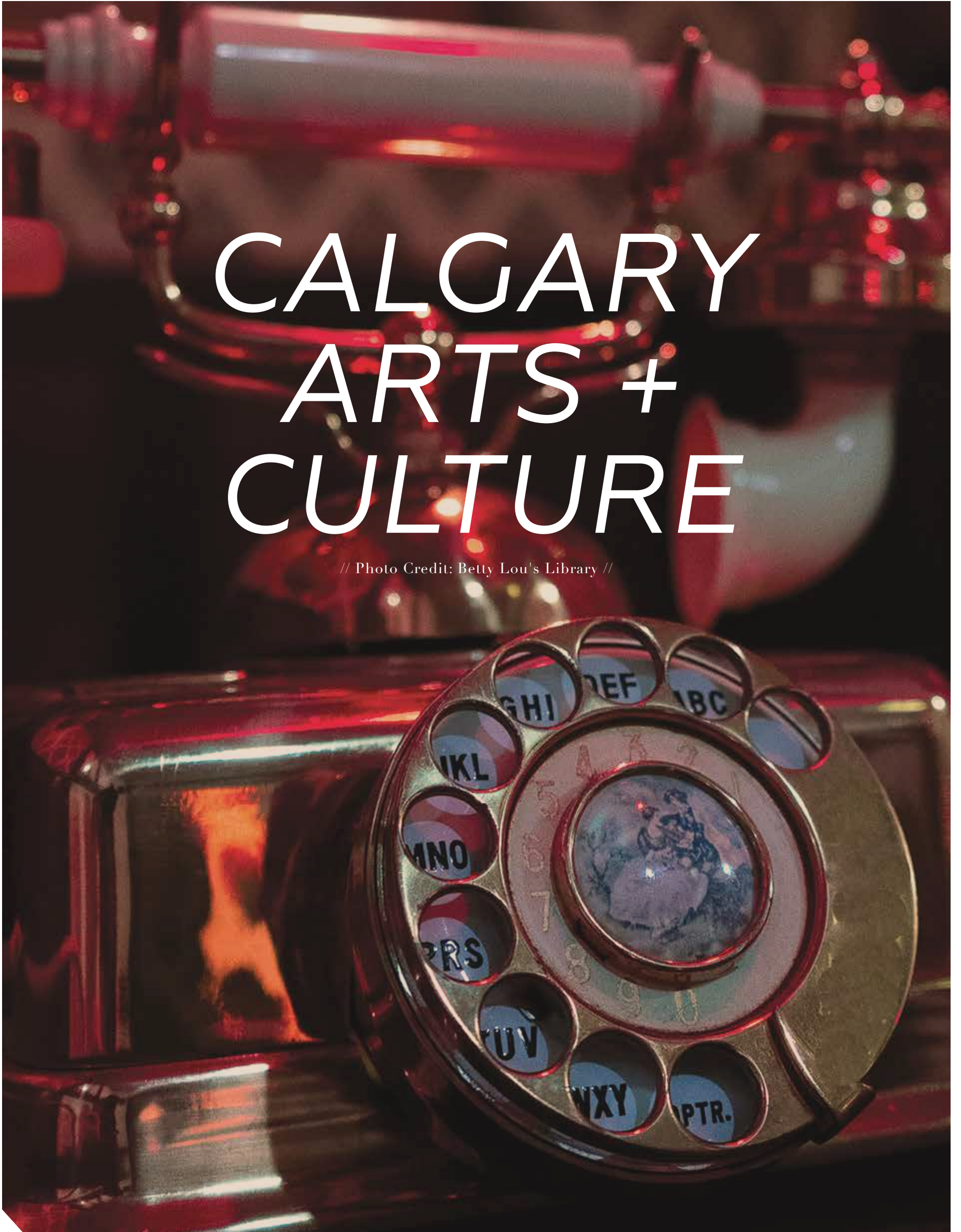

If you're in the mood for a night out that's a little different, this cheeky speakeasy is what you need. At the Devenish Building, 17th Avenue and 8th Street SW, you'll find a phone by a secret door. You can't get in on your own, but if you pick up the phone you'll be received into a throwback to a Prohibition era of curated cocktails, shining chandeliers, and classic performances.

Check your hoodies at the door though, because Betty Lou's is a place to dress for success and settle in to a high class entertainment experience. Do your research and get to know the house rules before you make your way down, but once inside you can experience live jazz Tuesday and Thursday nights, burlesque revues Wednesday nights, and smooth music curation the rest of the week.

MODERN RENDITIONS OF CLASSIC SOUL

José James has won global awards like the Edison Award and Best Vocal Album in 2010 for L'Académie du Jazz Grand Prix. He is a critically acclaimed jazz guitarist who blends classic technique with modern hip-hop elements, with recordings on the Brownswood Recordings, a label owned by BBC's legendary Gilles Peterson.

On November 15, James takes on one of soul's great, passionate mysteries, Bill Withers, in *Lean On Me: José James Celebrates Bill Withers*. Though he hasn't recorded an album in decades, Withers is one of the most enduring singers and lyricists in the history of R'n'B and soul music. Classics like *Lean On Me*, *Ain't No Sunshine*, *Use Me*, and *Lovely Day* are still played and loved by millions the world over.

It's only fitting that a young, vital, up-and-coming musician like José James take on such a heavyweight presence in the history of modern music. Catch the magic at Arts Commons at the Jack Singer Concert Hall on November 15.

AN EARLY HOLIDAY CLASSIC

The Nutcracker Suite is a staple of holiday arts offerings, so change things up a bit and see a modern Russian interpretation of the classic ballet with score by Tchaikovsky. The original is one of the foundational ballets in the Western canon, and features some of the most recognizable pieces in the Romantic period of classical music like *Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairies*. It is such an important work of art that its 1909 recording is considered to be the first ever piece of recorded music.

The Great Russian Nutcracker is the Moscow Ballet's grandiose, inspiring production complete with hand crafted costumes and nesting doll choreography. As always, it's a feast for the eyes fit for all ages, this time with a twist authentic to the origins of this classic piece. It takes place November 16th at the Jack Singer Concert Hall, so before the holiday fatigue sets in, get the family feeling warm and fuzzy and ready for the spirit of togetherness and celebration.

CHICKEN SUPREME

Courtesy of Jon Kristjanson at Compass Group Canada, one of the lead designers of the brand new Headquarters restaurant in Westman Village. Have a comforting poultry dinner without all the leftovers of a whole turkey, and all the sweet and tangy flavours of the family feast you know and love, plus the satisfying finish of a delectable dessert.

PREPARATION TIME: 5 MINS // COOKING TIME: 8 MINS IN SAUTÉ PAN + 8 MINS IN 450F OVEN // SERVES: 6

Roasted Chicken

- 6 x 7-8 oz. chicken
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- ½ tsp lemon juice
- ¼ tsp black pepper
- ¼ tsp sea salt
- ½ tsp lemon juice
- ½ package of poultry mix herbs fine chopped

- 1.** CHICKEN: Use gloved hands and red cutting board. Visually inspect each breast for bruising and bone chips, remove as required. Place in a large freezer bag.
- 2.** Add rest of ingredients and evenly coat each breast as much as possible. Allow to marinate for a minimum of two hours.
- 3.** Heat a small sauté pan with 1 tsp olive oil, when almost at smoke point,

- add chicken skin side down and cook until the meat lifts a little around the edges. Use tongs to carefully turn it over.
- 4.** Add 1 tsp butter and finish cooking in a 450F oven to an internal temperature of 165F.
- 5.** Remove to rest for two minutes. Serve on top of barley leek pilaf.

PREPARATION TIME: 2 MINS // COOKING TIME: 5 MINS // SERVES: 15 MELON BALLS

Caramelized Apples

- 1 red delicious apple, melon balled into 16 pieces
- 1 tsp butter
- 1 tbsp white sugar
- 1 tsp lemon juice
- ⅛ tsp ground cinnamon
- Pinch kosher salt
- 2 tbsp water

- 1.** APPLES: Wash apple, use a melon baller and scoop as close together to maximize usage.
- 2.** Add all ingredients into a small sauté pan and cook until water evaporates, stir with a spoon often. Test with a toothpick to ensure apples are soft.

- 3.** Place three apples and a braised leek on a tray and heat in a 400F oven.
- 4.** Plate one apple and one leek together – spaced at 2/6/10 on the plate.

So let’s take an imaginary walk through Headquarters with Jon, so he can introduce us to the food, space, and ideas behind your new favourite restaurant.

“Starting with the physical space, expect rich, warm wood tones, and beautiful tables with marble tops. We’ve got a baby grand piano in the lounge area with soft, comfortable leather seating. There are areas with couches and low seating to visit, and floor to ceiling screens that help guests define their experience in the room and set out the space, along with floor to ceiling windows to keep the space bright and enjoyable during the day. The whole place has some excellent finishing touches that I think people will really appreciate.”

“In terms of the menu, we’ve got a Spanish and Mediterranean inspired tapas menu, though it does travel the globe with a duck confit wonton to give it a Canadian and Asian flair. We’ve got some Italian pasta dishes, locally inspired and locally sourced venison and beef. There’s a Vietnamese tofu sub on the lunch menu, some continental European favourites with a twist, some Canadian born classics, and some Asian fusion to round it all off.”

Ultimately, Headquarters is meant to be bright, open and appealing to all. As Jon says, “the intent is really to welcome, and depending what you’re doing, like a

quick in and out luncheon, or a relaxed leisurely dinner, or socializing with friends, there are seating areas where the colour palette, the furniture, the flooring all lend themselves to those different types of eating environments.”

As if the food and drinks aren’t enough, weekends at Headquarters will feature smooth, engaging, jazzy musical performances as a warm and dynamic backdrop to your dining experience. Expect those types of extra touches, and a backbone of great service and fresh ingredients, and you’ve got the right idea of what to expect this fall when Headquarters opens up. Let’s let Jon take it away.

“We want to provide an excellent quality product that people can enjoy, with enough variety to satisfy different tastes, without so much as to be overwhelming. We are still trying to ensure we cover lots of territory, keep the quality first class, and drive a lot of value through the menu. You can enjoy a nice meal at lunch time for 12 to 20 dollars, and depending on your appetite we’ve got entrées that range from 17 to 35 dollars. Within that, we’ve got a focus on great quality, with good portions, not excessive, but certainly with the view of having good value and leaving feeling full.”

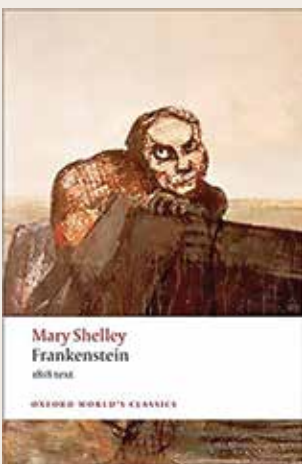

FRANKENSTEIN; OR, THE MODERN PROMETHEUS

Picture the dreary summer of 1816 in Switzerland. 18 year old Mary Shelley was traveling with her lover, future husband, and literary legend Percy Bysshe Shelley to visit another accomplished writer, the great Romantic Lord Byron. At the time, Byron was living in a mansion on Lake Geneva, and the entire planet had been locked in a strange never ending winter during the "Year Without A Summer" brought on by the eruption of Mount Tambora in 1815.

The grim weather and odd circumstances lent themselves to much time huddled around a fire and staying warm indoors, sharing ghost stories and discussing life and philosophy. Some days after a friendly challenge for each writer to create their own ghost story, Mary Shelley had what she called a "waking dream" of a man huddled over a being he created, growing horrified at his mockery of God's miracle.

That waking dream led to the creation of one of the most enduring stories and characters in horror, and indeed in Western literature. Despite the typical depiction of Dr. Victor Frankenstein's creation as a lumbering imbecile, in reality the Creature (who doesn't have a name) is articulate and intelligent. The lasting appeal of Shelley's story comes not from the image people associate with the name Frankenstein, but from the complex moral issues it tackles.

Without an identity or name, the Creature struggles to find a place in the world, and his freakish appearance scares away most everyone he tries to approach. He is caring and sympathetic in his own way while he hides from the world and comes to terms with who he is, but his creator is mortified by the aberration of his experiment.

Questions of personhood and moral responsibility permeate the book's narrative, and the very nature of creativity itself is on trial in Frankenstein. Dr. Frankenstein undertook his experiment see if he could do it, but didn't stop the think whether he should. If he'd considered the complex quandaries the unnatural creation of new life would raise, he may not have taken his curious project on.



Mere days after the ceremonial stake was driven at the site to become Westman Village, Debbie and Lonnie Wilton were cruising south Calgary in search of their new home.

The two sixty-somethings were looking for just the right downsize for their lifestyle. You know, updated and modern, but with some warmth and character, that doesn't cost an arm and a leg. After quite a few unsuccessful shopping trips, the right sign caught Debbie's eye.

"We looked at every condo being built in the south east, and we hadn't found anything, so two years ago we happened to be driving by on a Sunday and I saw the sign [for Westman Village] and said, "Oh my gosh, Jayman! We owned a Jayman home in Copperfield, and we absolutely loved our house."

That positive experience led the couple to the first version of the visitors' centre and the intrigue of the Westman Village

community focus. "The big thing that sold us on Westman initially was the community. We're real people people, we like socializing, and we thought that this way we'd be able to be part of things. We like the social aspect of it. We try to go every Friday to the social night."

As some of the earliest adopters of the Westman Village experience (they were the fourth couple to sign on the dotted line), they were actually in the very first group to experience the groundbreaking suite of amenities Westman Village now offers. When asked about her thoughts on the Village Centre, her thoughts were unequivocal: "We were over the moon. It was more than what we expected. We were blown away when we first saw the model. We thought there was no way it'd be this way, but if it was half as good as they said, it would have been great. It is probably one of the nicest places I've ever been in."

She and Lonnie jumped right into the Village Centre and now take their grandchildren down in the pools and in the art room and the gymnasium to play basketball, Debbie even uses some

event spaces for her dance studio. As soon as the two get their feet wet and are living full time in the Village, they'll be getting together for coffee or a glass of wine with their friends just down the hall, using the gym and pool and the woodworking shop.

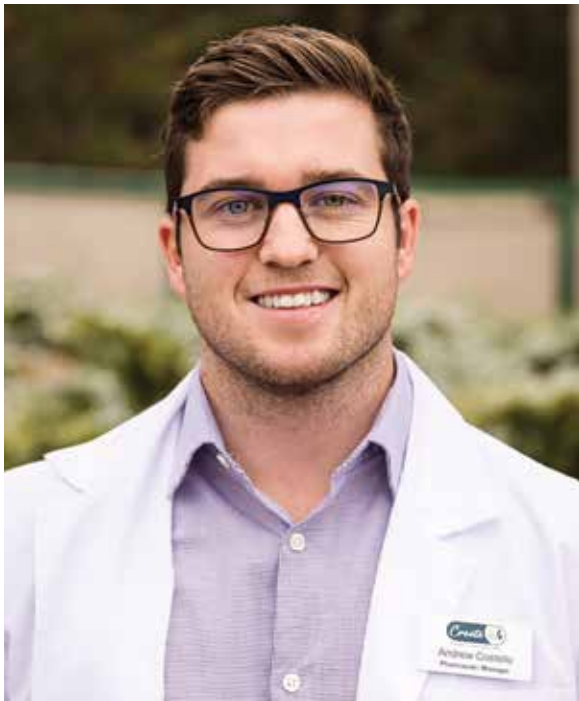

While over-the-counter medications, compliance packaging, and on the spot strep throat testing are all still available like any other pharmacy, Create still has a few more tricks up their sleeve to really set them apart from conventional pharmacies.

Create's holistic approach to health and wellbeing means a high priority placed on natural health remedies. High quality natural products by well respected companies can help Villagers improve their sleep and daytime alertness, prevent chronic illnesses, reduce inflammation, and balance hormone levels.

The Create team is also capable of another sophisticated pharmaceutical technique for people with specific needs: compounding. Without getting too bogged down in technical details, know that Andrew and Alzeen can customize the makeup and combination of medicines by combining and reconstituting treatments for patients with complex needs.

Above all, Create is about creating connections with the patients in and around Westman Village. They strive above all to serve the needs of their community by providing timely, customized, effective and personal medical care to everyone who needs.

AS FAMILIES START TO SPEND THEIR DAYS IN WESTMAN VILLAGE, SOME THINGS ARE MORE OBVIOUS THAN OTHERS.

Successful heating and cooling of your home is defined by its invisibility. People don't want to deal with the actual thing that heats or cools their living space, they just want to feel comfortable. To that end, the process of deciding on the practical side of living in Westman Village received just as much thought as the flashier elements.

Mark Diaz of Klass Mechanical Sales was front and center for the decision making process around the heating and cooling of Westman Village. As he tells it, the decision making process around this particular

detail became more intensive than usual. “Jayman was adamant about getting this particular unit, as it is the Ferrari of air conditioning units. The executive team wanted to see how well built they actually were, so it was a bit of a process, but it definitely worked out.”

So what is special about the air conditioning at Westman Village? The Mr. Slim P Series by Mitsubishi utilizes a heat pump system that works year round on one mechanical structure. A liquid called refrigerant is continuously cycled between the inside unit on your wall and a companion unit outside. That liquid transfers heat very effectively, which means that heat from inside your home can be absorbed and moved outside during summer, but can also be absorbed and transferred from the outside into your home during cooler weather.

This design works fine in warmer weather, but in sub zero temperatures the movement of that refrigerant can slow so much that heat can no longer be absorbed from the outside and moved inside. Mitsubishi Electric's engineers added a compressor specifically for colder climates to keep the refrigerant moving and transferring heat energy to temperatures as low as -30° C. In addition, since the system has no ducts like a typical furnace heating system, there is no heat lost to the meters of metal duct work between your cold living room and the furnace in the basement.

The sum total of benefits to this uniquely designed air conditioning unit is substantial. There is a patented technology called the 3D i-see Sensor that detects pockets

of hot and cold in rooms where installed and equalizes air temperature. Mr. Slim also uses 30% less energy than conventional heating since its compressor can vary its speed according to heating needs, unlike typical units. The final stroke of genius that determined the decision to utilize Mr. Slim in Westman Village, however, was its literally whisper quiet operation. It usually operates at a volume of 19 decibels – quieter than rustling leaves.

While it may be unusual for a purchaser to summon a chief executive from Toronto to discuss the minute details and benefits of air conditioning units, that is exactly what Jayman BUILT did to determine the best possible air and temperature quality for the residents of Westman Village. Like so many other elements here, there was time, love, care and thought put into the comfort level here in the Village.
